ATVP empowers individuals affected by domestic violence, sexual assault and abuse, and stalking. We work to create a safe and equitable community through education and prevention.



Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing specialized advocacy to victims of crime as well as community education and prevention programming. Founded in 1980, for over 42 years our free, confidential services have been available in Latah County, ID and Whitman County, WA. In state fiscal year 2021, ATVP operated with \$1,228,560 funded by federal, state and local grants at 88% and by local foundations, groups, churches, fundraisers and individuals at 12%. Community support and funding are critical to helping us meet crime victim needs, providing life-saving services, and continued expansion of our youth-focused violence prevention efforts.

The Pandemic Exacerbated Victim Needs



The demand for direct increased by 33% from the previous year.

SHELTER



Safe and Confidential Shelter for 139 individuals

Totaling 2,085 bed nights (one person, one night) at the confidential shelter.

VOLUNTEERS

3296.50 Hours of direct service donated by volunteers.

19 crisis line volunteers were trained.

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Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse specialized advocacy programming provided emergency shelter to victims of domestic violence and their dependent children. In addition to shelter, supportive services included: **24**-hour crisis intervention, legal assistance and court support, peer support groups, sexual assault specialized therapy, assistance with protective orders, family and child advocacy, transportation, food and clothing, employment and school assistance, and housing advocacy.

1251 individuals from our community sought out and received these services. This is a **33%** overall increase from the previous year. Our shelter services increased by **47%** within the pandemic conditions.

We helped **139** individuals who fled their homes for safety.
